


Why is Brookcrest so Special?

experience stayed with them, and was the deciding factor on where their journey would eventually take them.

If you're not familiar with Brookcrest, let me explain. On paper, Brookcrest is one of the 446 skilled nursing facilities in the state. Built in 1968, its physical stature is that of a traditional nursing home. It serves 114 people in need of continuous skilled nursing care, and rehabilitates those who are caught in the middle of hospital and home. The majority of payment for services comes through the fixed payment models of Medicare and Medicaid reimbursement.

Now, if you're from around here, you may have heard it described a little differently. Most often, we hear, "There's something about that place – it doesn't feel like a nursing home." Or, "It's so special there, everyone seems happy."

When I first moved to West Michigan in 2003, I heard these things about Brookcrest, but it wasn't until I stepped through the doors for my first interview, that my heart felt them. As a recent graduate, looking for an entry level position, I had visited many nursing homes – those who provided continuous and short term care, who were reimbursed through Medicare and Medicaid, who were licensed the same

Ifirst met Win a few years ago when she wheeled up to my office door at Brookcrest and asked if she could speak to me. She was thrilled to see me wearing a white button down shirt and a tie. It reminded her of her deceased husband who always wore white shirts. He served many years as a pastor, so I immediately felt a sense of holy pride that she thought I looked like a preacher.

In a matter of 30 seconds, my bubble was burst when she went on to explain that prior to becoming a preacher her husband had been a butcher who always wore white shirts. I reminded her of a butcher and she had a complaint about the beef roast that was served for Sunday dinner. Whoever had carved the roast had done it wrong. They had cut it parallel to the grain instead of cutting across it. She was indignant that our kitchen staff didn't know any better than that. I acted as though I totally understood her concern, (but I didn't really), and immediately apologized for the extra chewing she had to do. Since then, Win and I have been great friends.

Over the years I made a special point of showing Win whenever I had a white shirt on. It would cheer her up and it provided me a day to pretend I was a preacher, or a butcher.

In fact, I came across a verse that encourages this particular dress code. King Solomon wrote in Ecclesiastes 9:8 "Always be clothed in white, and always anoint your head with oil."

But now Win has gone on ahead and is part of the great cloud of witnesses. "After this I looked and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and in front of the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and were holding palm branches in their hands. And they cried out in a loud voice: 'Salvation belongs to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb." Rev.7:9-10

Win said she would be watching for me. I hope she can pick me out of the crowd with my white shirt.


